About the Course: 2025 CPT Training Requirements



Pursuant to Ohio Revised Code 109.803, the Ohio Peace Officer Training Commission (OPOTC) is required to set a minimum number of hours for continued professional training (CPT) if there is supporting funding. The Ohio General Assembly has once again provided funding for CPT hours in 2025. The OPOTC Commission has established the following distribution of

the 24 hours.

Day One – 8 Hours – "Four mandatory topics", totaling 8 hours set by the Commission that all peace officers and troopers must take in 2025 are:

2 hours Ethics Laws

2 hours Legal Updates

I hour Arrest, Search and Seizure

3 hours Use of Force

16 Hours – "The additional 16 hours" of training must be completed focusing on any combination of the following specific topic categories: The North Coast Polytechnic Institute (NCPI) will be providing 16 hours of training related to the following law enforcement topics and hours

Day Two – Officer Trauma and Wellness (4 hours), Report Writing (3 hours) Vehicle Dynamics (1 hour)

Day Three - Leadership (5 hours), Domestic Violence (3 hours)
