## About the Course: 2023 CPT Training Requirements



Pursuant to Ohio Revised Code 109.803, the Ohio Peace Officer Training Commission (OPOTC) is required to set a minimum number of hours for continued professional training (CPT) if there is supporting funding. On December 15, 2022, the General Assembly under HB45 provided funding for

CPT hours in 2023. The OPOTC Commission, at its January 10, 2023 meet-

ing established the following distribution of the 24 hours.

8 Hours – "Three mandatory topics", totaling 8 hours set by the Commission that all peace officers and troopers must take in 2023 are:

3 hours	School Threat and Safety Training
3 hours	Legal Updates
2 hours	Arrest, Search and Seizure

16 Hours – "Optional training topics" at the direction of the Agency Administrator: The North Coast Polytechnic Institute (NCPI) will be providing 16 hours of "Optional" training related to the following law enforcement topics:

4 hours	Ethical Leadership and Accountability
4 hours	Crucial Conversations
4 hours	Criminal Patrol/Interdiction – Looking Beyond the Traffic Stop
2 hours	Verbal Judo/Crisis De-Escalation
2 hours	Officer Wellness
