About the Course: 2026 CPT Training Requirements



Pursuant to Ohio Revised Code 109.803, the Ohio Peace Officer Training Commission (OPOTC) is required to set a minimum number of hours for continued professional training (CPT) if there is supporting funding. The Ohio General Assembly has once again provided funding for CPT hours in 2026. The OPOTC Commission has identified eight (8) hours of mandatory training; the remaining 16 hours consists of optional training topics that will need to be pre-approved by OPOTA. In 2026, NCPI will be offering the following CPT training through the Seven Hills Police Department:

Day One – 8 Hours on Search and Seizure/Search Warrants – with emphasis on why cops stop people, length of investigative detentions, stop & frisk, search incident to arrest, motor vehicle probable cause, plain view, plain feel, inventory, consent, abandoned property, and search warrants.

(NOTE: Seven Hills modified the day 1 training program for their schools.)

Day Three – 8 Hours – (Mandatory day); OPOTA is requiring eight (8) hours on the following 5 topics:

2 hours	Legal Updates
1 hour	Missing Persons (part of the 3 hour legal update)
2 hours	Communications
2 hours	Compliance and Control Tactics
1 hour	Firearms

About the Instructors



William D. Healy was a career law enforcement officer who had been a member of the law enforcement community for over 29 years. He also served as a Lieutenant and Highway Patrol training coordinator at the Ohio State Highway Patrol Training Academy for over five years. Mr. Healy is a graduate of the Southern Police Institute's Administrative Officers Course at the University of Louisville. Mr. Healy is a former adjunct professor of constitutional law at Ohio University. He has been certified as a Police Instructor through OPOTA for over 36 years and has trained tens of thousands of law enforcement officers in a variety of disciplines. He is the Director of the North Coast Polytechnic Institute.

Mr. Healy or another member of his staff will teach all of the 1st day training topics in the 2026 CPT program.

Additional Instructors: NCPI will be using various additional instructors to teach the Day 2 and Day 3 training topics. All of these instructors will meet the requirements established by OPOTA and have been pre-approved by OPOTA to teach for NCPI in the 2026 CPT training programs.
