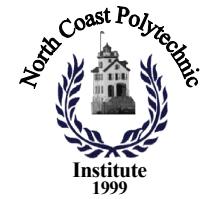

About the course:

“Criminal Patrol/Drug Interdiction”

This three (3) day course is designed to teach the street officer aggressive traffic enforcement principles on how to detect and apprehend drug couriers who are transporting narcotics and currency in motor vehicles on our streets and highways. Across this nation,

highly trained criminal patrol enforcement officers are seizing tons of narcotics and millions of dollars from traffic stops of motorists. In Ohio alone, Ohio State Highway Patrol Troopers have seized over \$100 million in narcotics and currency over the past 6 years. This training is designed to assist officers in learning the successful techniques and practices to “look beyond the traffic stop” and employ effective and efficient criminal patrol interdiction operations.

About the topics:

- Introduction to the nationwide drug problem and its impact on crime and our communities
- Identifying the drug courier with emphasis on drug courier indicators
- Questioning and interviewing techniques
- Search and seizure principles with emphasis on motor vehicle related searches
- Concealed compartments in motor vehicles
- Commercial vehicle interdiction and awareness of “big truck/big load”
- Canine investigation and operation
- Utilization of controlled deliveries
- Asset forfeiture at the federal and state level
- Officers safety concerns and issues



About the instructor:



Mr. William D. Healy was a career law enforcement officer for the past 30 years. He retired from the Ohio State Highway Patrol after 24 years of service. He was the coordinator of the Patrol's Traffic Drug Interdiction Teams (TDIT). Mr. Healy has taught drug interdiction/criminal patrol enforcement throughout Ohio and the United States for the Drug Enforcement Administration, the Narcotics Association of Regional Coordinating Officers (NARCO) and the Drug Interdiction Assistance Program (DIAP). He is also a former adjunct professor of constitutional law at Ohio University. He is the Director of the North-coast Polytechnic Institute (NPI) in Lorain County.

Mr. Shaun Smart is a twenty-four (24) year veteran of Ohio State Highway Patrol. For the past twenty (20) years he has been assigned to the Criminal Patrol/Drug Interdiction Unit where he has served as an interdiction trooper, canine handler and supervisor. Currently Shaun is a canine handler assigned to the Dayton Highway Patrol Post. He is the most decorated interdiction officer in the history of Ohio State Highway Patrol having seized more narcotics and currency than any other officer. He was the recipient of the National interdiction officer of the year from the Drug Interdiction Assistance Program (DIAP) in 2002. He has taught interdiction training program across the U.S. for DIAP & the DEA.
