
About the course:

This four (4) day school is designed to provide information and training to the Field Training Officer (FTO) to prepare a probationary officer with the necessary information and tools to properly and professionally begin their career as a peace officer. The FTO is an integral part in assisting the probationary officer to make the transition from the classroom environment to the application of learned skills in field situations. The training program will include information on the role of the FTO, the adult learning concepts, the evaluation process, civil liability issues, coaching and mentoring, ethical leadership, effective communication skills and documentation in the FTO manual. Each student will receive two (2) thorough and detailed comprehensive FTO training manuals (San Jose and LA models) that should serve as a documentation and evaluation tool to successfully promote the development of the probationary officer. Both manuals will also be on a CD ROM that will be provided to each student.
