## About the Course: Will Meet 2022 CPT Training Requirements



In 2022, the AG and OPOTA announced that 24 hours of Continuing Professional Training (CPT) will be required for all law enforcement officers. The Ohio Attorney General's Office and the Ohio Peace Officer Training Academy have been tasked with launching a \$15 million pilot program to help fund continuing professional training (CPT) for law enforcement officers, per the biennial operating budget passed by the Ohio General Assembly in summer 2021. Sworn officers and troopers who graduated from an academy in 2021 or earlier will be required to take 24 hours of advanced training in 2022, and the state will pay the agency up to 50% of those officers' salaries for the training. For calendar year 2022, peace officers and troopers must receive 24 hours of CPT. The Ohio Peace Officer Training Commission (OPOTC) has approved the broad categories in which the required training must be completed.

OPOTA has developed lesson plans for all of the "core" topics. All of the 4 hours of training being provided at the Cleveland Metroparks Police Department will be from the OPOTA "core" topics and will be provided as follows:

### **"Diversity – Building Trust and Mutual Respect"**

**(Mandatory 4 hours)**

**\*NOTE: OPOTA has approved the four (4) hour training lesson plan related to "Diversity – Building Trust and Mutual Respect" as a replacement for the mandatory "Diversity, Equity and Inclusion" topic. So, NCPI will be offering the mandatory 4 hour "Diversity – Building Trust and Mutual Respect" training program in all of the CPT training programs.**
