## About the Course: 2024 CPT Training Requirements



Pursuant to Ohio Revised Code 109.803, the Ohio Peace Officer Training Commission (OPOTC) is required to set a minimum number of hours for continued professional training (CPT) if there is supporting funding. The Ohio General Assembly has once again provided funding for CPT hours in 2024. The OPOTC Commission has established the following distribution of the 24 hours.

**8 Hours – “Five mandatory topics“, totaling 8 hours set by the Commission that all peace officers and troopers must take in 2024 are:**

- 2 hours        Responding to Mental Health Issues**
- 2 hours        Legal Updates**
- 2 hours        Crisis De-Escalation**
- 1 hour         NIBIN**
- 1 hour         Marsy’s Law/Victims Rights**

**16 Hours – “Optional training topics” at the direction of the Agency Administrator:  
The North Coast Polytechnic Institute (NCPI) will be providing 16 hours of “Optional” training related to the following law enforcement topics:**

- 8 hours        Search and Seizure/Search Warrants**
- 3 hours        Team Building and Motivation**
- 3 hours        Officer Safety**
- 2 hours        Court Testimony**

## About the Instructors

He has been certified as a Police Instructor through OPOTA for over 36 years and has trained tens of thousands of law enforcement officers in a variety of disciplines. He is the Director of the North Coast Polytechnic Institute.
