About the Course: Will Meet 2022 CPT Training Requirements



In 2022, the AG and OPOTA announced that 24 hours of Continuing Professional Training (CPT) will be required for all law enforcement officers. The Ohio Attorney General's Office and the Ohio Peace Officer Training Academy have been tasked with launching a \$15 million pilot program to help fund continuing professional training (CPT) for law enforcement officers, per the biennial operating budget passed by the Ohio General Assembly in summer 2021. Sworn officers and troopers who graduated from an academy in 2021 or earlier will be required to take 24 hours of advanced training in 2022, and the state will pay the agency up to 50% of those officers' salaries for the training. For calendar year 2022, peace officers and troopers must receive 24 hours of CPT. The Ohio Peace Officer Training Commission (OPOTC) has approved the broad categories in which the required training must be completed.

OPOTA has developed lesson plans for all of the "core" topics. All of the 8 hours of training being provided at the Whitehall Police Department will be from the OPOTA "core" topics and will be provided as follows:

Legal Updates (4 hours)

Constitutional 4th Amendment case law decisions from the U.S. and Ohio Supreme Courts will be discussed and new Ohio laws enacted by the State Legislature in 2021 will be reviewed.

Use of Force (4 hours)

All use of force issues and claims are 4th Amendment seizures and constitutional case law decisions from the U.S. and Ohio Supreme Courts will be reviewed. In addition, the standards on when, how and how much force can be used will be discussed. The Use of Force Continuum will also be analyzed.

William D. Healy was a career law enforcement officer who had been a member of the law enforcement community for over 29 years. For over 24 years, Mr. Healy had been a member of the Ohio State Highway Patrol and was the coordinator of the Highway Patrol's Traffic Drug Interdiction Team (TDIT).
