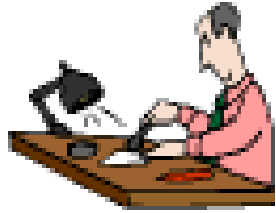


About the course:



"Students will receive hands-on experience..."

"Crime Scene Processing and Evidence Analysis"

This 40 hour program is designed to provide the student with an understanding of the fundamental theories of physical evidence, its identification, preservation, collection and packaging. Instruction will encompass crime scene management, crime scene searching, sketching and photography. In addition, the forensic laboratory's role in the evidence analysis process and its capabilities in providing scientific support to the investigative process will be discussed. Students will

receive hands-on experience in processing evidence samples and will also receive hands-on experience with special powders, chemicals and plasters. Practical, simulated crime scene search exercises will be conducted during the week. Each student will receive a basic latent fingerprint/evidence collection kit that includes brushes, powders and lifting material.



About the Instructors

Captain Jack Hall is a career law enforcement officer who has over 17 years experience and is currently assigned as a Captain at the Cleveland Metroparks Ranger Department. In Fairview Park, Ohio. He previously served as a Sergeant in charge of the Avon Lake Police Department's Detective Bureau for over 12 years. He has handled cases focusing on financial fraud, drugs and sexual-related crimes. Captain Hall has also completed specialized training in computer forensics and practical homicide investigation. He is a former adjunct faculty member of Lorain County Community College's School of Police Science (1993-1994). He is an OPOTA certified instructor.

Mr. William D. Healy was a career law enforcement officer for the past 29 years, including the past 25 years as a member of the Ohio State Highway Patrol. He was Commander of the Highway Patrol's Traffic Drug Interdiction Team (TDIT). Mr. Healy has a Bachelor's Degree from Ohio University and a Master's Degree from Central Michigan University in General Administration. He is a graduate of the Southern Police Institute's Administrative Officer's Course at the University of Louisville. He has served as an instructor for the Northwestern University Traffic Institute (NUTI), the International Association of Chief of Police (IACP), the Drug Enforcement Administration and the Drug Interdiction Assistance Program. He has also served as an expert on search and seizure while serving on various search and seizure instructional panels at the Ohio Attorney General's Conference on Law Enforcement.

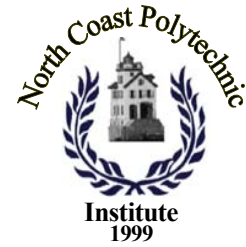
