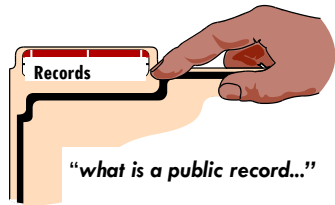

Staff Lieutenant Jeffrey Davis began his career with the Ohio State Highway Patrol in 1999 after serving two years as a deputy sheriff for both Mahoning and Stark Counties. At the Highway Patrol, he was assigned to road patrol, criminal investigations, criminal intelligence, administrative investigations, and regional training. He currently serves as the Highway Patrol's risk manager and oversees policies, accreditation, records, statistical analysis, and research and development. In addition, S/LT Davis served as a subject matter expert for the Ohio Peace Officer Training Commission and routinely lectures on topics related to search and seizure, civil liability, bias-based policing, and American government for the Highway Patrol Training Academy, MAGLOCLIN, Columbus State Community College, and the Ohio State University's Public Safety Leadership Academy. S/LT Davis earned a bachelor's degree in political science from Youngstown State University in 1998. In 2006, he earned a juris doctor degree from the Capital University Law School and is licensed to practice law by the Supreme Court of Ohio.



There have been numerous changes to Ohio's Public Records Laws over the past several years. The Ohio Public Records Act evolved from the principle that Ohio's citizens are entitled to access the records of their government. To advance that principle, the Public Records Act is to be interpreted liberally in favor of disclosure. This seminar will address the Public Records Law and Record Retention issues. A review of what is a public record will be conducted. In addition, the exceptions to the Public Records Law will be discussed and reviewed. Finally, records management and records retention issues will be reviewed.

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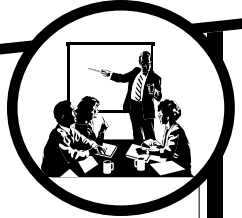
