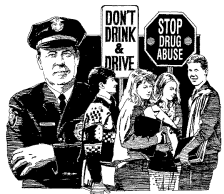

How do you determine and verify whether the DUS suspension or FRA suspension was properly administered? This seminar will answer all of these questions.

**“DUS, DUI, & FRA ISSUES”** This four (4) hour seminar will deal with statutory and case law issues concerning the Driving under the Influence of Alcohol or Substance Abuse (DUI) laws, the Driving under Suspension (DUS) laws and the Financial Responsibility Act (FRA). All of these issues are extremely important to uniformed patrol officers who have responsibility to work traffic enforcement. Many of these officers have not had extensive training in any of these legal areas in their careers. The Ohio Basic Peace Officer Training requirements only mandate about 16 hours in traffic law enforcement. As a result, peace officers are not thoroughly prepared in statutory traffic law issues, let alone in constitutional case law

In addition, Mr. Healy is a former adjunct professor of constitutional law at Ohio University. He is a certified instructor with the Ohio Peace Officer's Training Council (OPOTC).
